You will need:



Your mobile phone, tablet or computer with internet connection.

Your Ontario health card or Cancer Centre's appointment sheet

10-15 minutes if this is your first time.

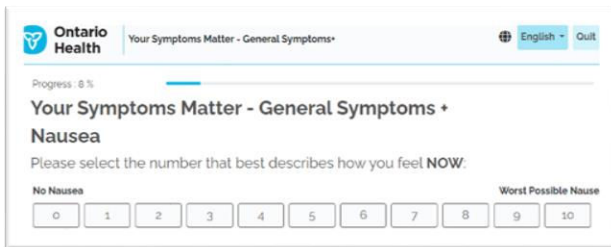

What is Your Symptoms Matter (YSM)?

Your Symptoms Matter (YSM) is a symptom screening tool used to tell your healthcare team if you are having any symptoms related to your visit. **It is not a COVID-19 screening tool.**

This question is asking you to rate your nausea (feel like throwing up or vomiting) **today** from a scale of 0 to 10. A score of 0 means you do not have any nausea today. A score of 10 means that your nausea is at its very worst.

Why is it important to complete YSM?

Filling out YSM can help you and your healthcare team to:

- Notice and treat symptoms early on
- Talk about the symptoms that matter to you
- Track your symptoms over time to see how they have changed and possible causes

Over 14 years of research and millions of symptom screenings has shown that patients who complete YSM:

- Are less likely to visit the Emergency Department
- Have better outcomes after their cancer treatment

Where and when do I complete YSM?

You complete YSM 1 day before your appointment. You can complete YSM at home using your mobile phone, tablet or computer with internet connection. If your appointment is in-person at a hospital or clinic, you can also complete YSM when you arrive. There are computers and tablets for you to use, or you can also use your own device.



Important:

Do not complete more than 1 day before your appointment. Your YSM scores are not reviewed until your appointment time. Please bring up any questions about your symptoms at your appointment. **If you are having an urgent medical issue, please go to your nearest emergency department right away.** Call the Cancer Centre Symptom Support Telephone Service (triage) if you need help with your symptoms. How do I print my YSM results?

On your mobile phone or computer:

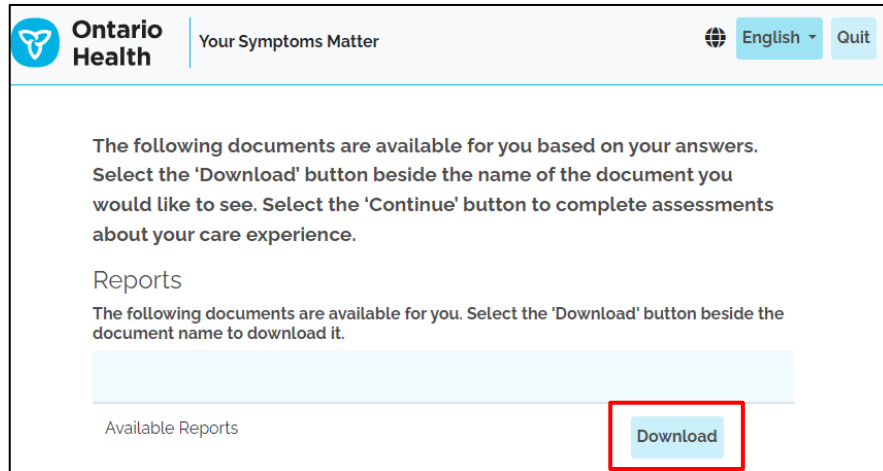


Figure 1: the Reports page on Your Symptoms Matter.

When you get to the end of the screening questions, you will see this screen (see Figure 1 below as an example). Click on **Download**.

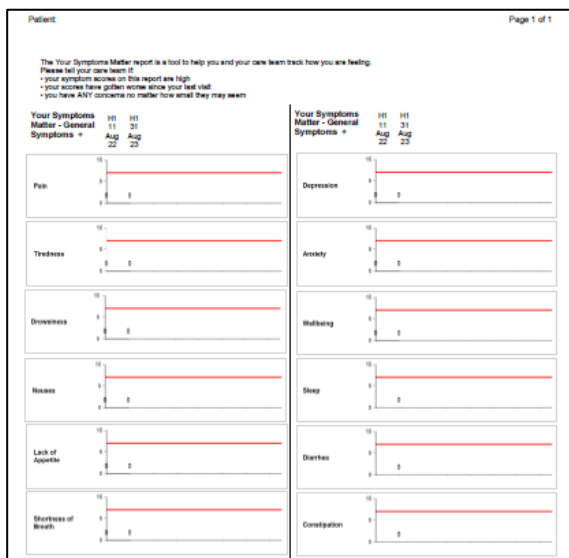


Figure 2: Summary of symptom screening results.

On your **mobile phone**, you will see a screen with some line graphs (see Figure 2 for an example).

This is your symptom screening results. You can take a photo of this screen or print to a printer that is set up to print from your mobile phone.

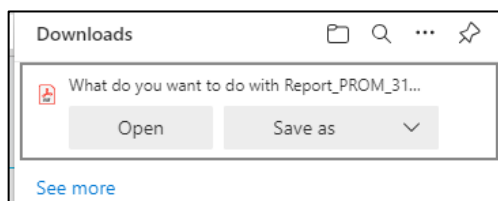


Figure 3: Pop up window with options to open or save your symptom screening results to your computer.

If you are using a **computer**, a pop-up will appear asking if you want to Open the file or Save on your computer. See Figure 3 for an example of the pop-up window. If you click Open, you should see a document with the line graphs (see Figure 2 for an example) which is your symptom screening results.

After you open the document, you can print the document from your computer.
